New Logo Expresses Spirit of our Apostolate

Regular readers of *Time and Life* will certainly notice a change in format with this issue, a “new look” inspired by our Congregation’s new international logo. Designed at our motherhouse in France, the logo’s rich symbolism offers insight into the spirit of our Congregation and our mission to the elderly.

Central to the logo are the figures of an older person, and behind him, a Little Sister. It is no accident that the Little Sister seems almost hidden behind the elderly gentleman. She is there to support him, to accompany him on his journey through the stage of life that is old age. This was the prophetic vision of our foundress, Blessed Jeanne Jugan. The Little Sisters were to stand behind the elderly, to be their sisters, and at the same time, their servants.

It is still our joy to “be there” for the aged, to share our lives with them. We strive to create a real Home (symbolized by the protective outer circle, roofline and doorway in the logo), an atmosphere of love and esteem where older persons—who so often find themselves marginalized and devalued—may find fulfillment and happiness, where they will be given the place of honor at life’s table.

On the wall of the Home are engraved the initials of Blessed Jeanne Jugan. The map

of the world highlights the international scope of our order with 205 Homes in 31 Countries.





