As we continue to deal with the Coronavirus pandemic, we wanted to keep you informed as to what we are doing at Jeanne Jugan Residence in San Pedro to protect and care for our dear Residents.

The health and well-being of our Residents and Staff is our number one priority. As we have now received direction from the California Department of Health regarding the continuation of mandatory COVID-19 testing at our Home, we will continue the weekly testing of our Residents in the Skilled Nursing Unit, Little Sisters and staff for the foreseeable future.

We are grateful for the continued in-kind donations of personal protective equipment (PPE) and disinfectant supplies needed to keep our Home safe.

Our Residents continue to practice "social distancing", wearing masks around the Home, receiving meals in their rooms. We have increased the number of "escorted outside strolls" for our Residents in the skilled nursing floor to get them outside into the fresh air and sunshine. The Activities Assistant on the skilled nursing floor goes to each individual room and does arts & crafts with the Residents, Facetimes with the families, and does one on one exercises with them. Our Residents on the 1st, 3rd and Apartments walk around our beautiful grounds enjoying the beautiful flowers and ocean views. Thank God, in the midst of a pandemic we have beautiful grounds here in San Pedro for them to walk and remain active all while social distancing. The Activities department has created a way for them to play social distanced bingo, listening to music in the common area six feet apart and even dancing once in a while. Our Residents have also been very creative by doing individual art projects to keep themselves busy. We started family visits on September 1, where our Residents are inside the Home, while their family members are outside in our little private courtyard; separated by two plexiglass shields. Our Residents and families have truly enjoyed these short thirty-minute visits, even if they have to keep their mask and gloves on during the entire visit. The Residents have enjoyed meeting their new Grandchildren, Great Grand Children for the first time, the gifts and goodies that their families bring them, but most importantly it's being able to visit with their loved ones that is most important.

We're thankful for our dedicated staff, the Residents and the Residents families for following the guideline and for trying very hard to keep themselves and our Home well and safe from COVID.

Our trust in God's Providence and Protection has never wavered. We continue to pray for the safety and good health of all of you and ask that a cure for this virus may be found quickly.

Thank you all for your continued prayers and support. These are trying times, but together, we will get through this difficulty because we are not only partners in a Mission, but one family with God.
